

How big an inverter should a 1kW photovoltaic power station use

The key is understanding how much power your home actually uses, how solar panels deliver that power and how inverters handle real-world loads. Get it wrong and you risk wasted ...

Here's the cheat code: your inverter size should match your solar panel output. If your system pushes 5,000 watts, a 5,000-watt (or 5 kW) inverter is usually the move.

As a general rule of thumb, the size of your inverter should be similar to the DC rating of your solar panel system; if you are installing a 6 kilowatt (kW) system, you can expect ...

In the example we used above, we determined that we need to supply 1,700 watts of power at the same time. In this type of situation, we would recommend selecting an inverter that offers a bit more ...

A general rule of thumb is that you will need a 1,000 watt (1kW) inverter for every 1 kilowatt (kW) worth of solar panels. So, if you have 4 kW of solar panels, you would need at least a 4kW inverter.
