

How to drill holes in the frame of photovoltaic panels

Oftentimes, this may involve drilling holes into the side of the solar panels to attach them to mounting brackets or frames. However, it is crucial to handle the drilling process with care to avoid ...

Installing solar panels is easier when you construct sturdy, precision-fit frames. Cut aluminum rails to size, drill mounting holes, and assemble the frame using corner brackets and bolts. ...

Use the 1/4" drill bit to pre-drill anchor holes in their marked locations. Draw a line running horizontal and vertical with your anchor hole so you can easily line up the centering tick marks ...

Drilling into the side of a solar panel can create micro-cracks in the cells, compromise the integrity of the metal framework, and allow water and debris to enter the panel.

I mounted my 180w pv panel to the 12" high side wall of my aluminum framed full roof rack with a stainless steel piano hinge so it could be propped up at an optimum angle when needed.

Use short self tappers so you don't hit the back of the panel if you screw them in at an angle. Waterproof the screw heads after. Even if they are facing down. Reason: water can get in over ...
